

MINUTES

of the **Horsforth Churches Together** Virtual Meeting Wednesday 9th March 2022 By Zoom. 7.30pm.

Welcome Rachel welcomed everyone and opened the meeting in prayer with a particular focus on Ukraine. Minutes and Matters Arising The minutes from 12 Jan were agreed with no matters arising. MHA (Live at Home) Judith Colley gave an update on the work at MHA. They had continued to support people through covid with door to door visits. They still meet at Central and they celebrated their 25th anniversary in November with a party. She outlined some of their activities – lunch club, bacon butties, 41 Christmas dinners, mince pie drop off, annual memorial, Burns night, visiting recorder group, twice monthly local walks led by Lyn Cadmore, 'Love to Move' exercise class, fellowship led by church folk. They have linked with Morrisons to hold a dementia café and are planning one to include Easter treats. They meet in the Yoga Café for their 'Living with Loss' sessions	Action By:
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supported by Leeds Bereavment Forum and the Community Foundation. They received Winter Wellbeing funding of £2500 and delivered members a 'hug in a mug' – a mug containing a range of sundries which were well received. They organise regular trips out and a holiday in Llandudno is planned for September. Wheelchairs are usually accepted on coaches as they want to be fully accessible. The Queen's Tea party is planned on 31st May and 7 June. They currently have 680 members which represents 13.3% of Horsforth's elderly population. They are targeted to increase to 15% (80 more members) so Judith is keen to encourage new people who simply need to give their names to her or go along to one of their activities and they will receive their regular newsletter outlining all activities. They currently deliver 400 newsletters. Volunteers and befrienders are always welcome and the support from the churches is much appreciated. Some of their partners include LS18 Rocks, Churches, Morrisons, New Croft, memory support workers, Bedford Court, the Library. Members are generally doing well and new friendships are being formed. MHA particularly focuses on loneliness, dementia, loss and mobility. Judith was thanked for all their hard work and Judith Briggs prayed for them.	
Covid Memorial – 'Two Years On' On Wednesday, 23 Mar, HCT plan to hold an event at The Grove to mark two years on from the first lockdown. The plan is to encourage passers-by to write on ribbons their response to the pandemic and tie them to the railings. Different coloured ribbons could represent different things – yellow for sadness, red for loss, blue for thanks. It will last from 10am until 6pm and tea and coffee will be available. There will be 3 short services for prayer at 10am, 2pm and 6pm. Volunteers are needed to fill hourly slots. Publicity will be distributed to the churches giving all the details. A letter has also gone out to schools. The ribbons will remain in place until Palm Sunday.	All churches
